Clerk of the Year

Congratulations Lonnie McKechnie, CMC, Mat-Su Borough Clerk, 2022 AAMC Clerk of the Year!



Lonnie was nominated by her Managers and Attorney, with support from her Mayor, former Mayor, and a local teacher. They recognized her strengths in facilitating meetings and discussion to address difficult topics through appropriate venues and scheduling. As well as her commitment to her own professional development by attendance at AAMC conferences despite scheduling challenges, and educating board and commission members in parliamentary procedure. She takes education to young people in her community by hosting up to 125 students and parent chaperones in the assembly chambers to conduct mock assembly meetings where these third graders participate as elected officials and concerned citizens to debate and vote on various issues, such as whether to spend money on a fire truck or park improvements.

Clerk of the Year Award History

The Clerk of the Year award was established in 2000 to recognize Alaska municipal clerks who have made significant contributions toward furthering the municipal clerk professional development through education, demonstrating leadership, and making significant contributions to the quality of life in their community.

But what her nominators really bring home is Lonnie's knowledge, professionalism, ability to lead, and grace under pressure related to elections where they say she has performed remarkably.

Her municipality is one of the few who hold their local elections concurrently with the State election. The State is not able to share their election equipment or workers so she has to coordinate separate election officials, ballots, and equipment for the local elections. In addition to recruiting, training and coordinating election officials, she organizes details to avoid voter confusion, minimize wait times, and provide voters with a clear and understandable process for voting both elections at shared polling locations.

In 2020 Lonnie was instrumental in executing an emergency ordinance in short order to suspend the witness requirement for by mail ballots to be consistent with the States directive during the pandemic, and successfully navigated the closure of an early and absentee polling location when a worker tested positive for COVID, while honoring the people's right to vote early. And if that wasn't enough, a recount was called for a district where there was an 11 vote difference, and upon completion of the recount, the results were unchanged, demonstrating integrity in elections in a chaotic year.

To quote her nominators, "Her performance continues to demonstrate to the Mayor, Assembly, Borough officials, and the public that a professional clerk is an indispensable part of a well-functioning local government and a vital component for public involvement and engagement."

Lonnie started in the clerk profession in 2002 as an administrative assistant, promoted to Secretary to the Clerk, Deputy Borough Clerk, and was appointed as Borough Clerk in 2008. As President of AAMC in 2015 she asked us to go boldly as clerks, and she continues to lead with that in mind.
